## MEMORANDUM

TO: Mr. James Mause

FROM: R Adams Cowley, M.D.

Since your request. I have re-examined last year's bill that we had previously revised concerning codification of the Maryland EMS system.

The purpose of the bill is to create a single administration and hence a single statewide EMS system incorporating the resources of the MIEM which has provided the impetus to EMS systems not only in Maryland but throughout the country.

In developing a single administration, a question last year arose as to who the system should report to. We are aware that it cannot be a separate agency. We are also aware that the program could not be placed within the Department of Health & Mental Hygiene because that department does not wish to be responsible for a hospital system (MIEM) and, therefore, the only other alternative is to have the program report to another state agency - the University of Maryland. By adding on Page 5, Section 458 Part B, a statement "and will report to the President of the University of Maryland" and then on Page 7, Section 461 remove that paragraph and incorporate "the Maryland EMS Administration shall manage the MIEM as a part of the University system and will utilize this resource as the hub This would take care of providing a statewide of the statewide system". uniform system with one Director and one administration reporting to the University of Maryland and coordinate all aspects of the EMS program. We would thus serve the very important essential concerns for efficiency and economy in providing EMS management and care statewide.

IN ADDITION, THE MEDICAL MANAGEMENT CONSULTANT GROUP
WOULD BE CONTINUED AND THE DIRECTOR WOULD HAVE THE
AUTHORITY TO APPOINT ADDITIONAL COUNCILS AND COMMITTEES
WHICH HE DEEMS NECESSARY FOR THE FURTHERANCE OF THE
EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES SYSTEM. MEMBERS OF THE
COUNCILS AND/OR COMMITTEES SHALL RECEIVE PAYMENT FOR
EXPENSES ACTUALLY AND NECESSARILY INCURRED.

- 4. COORDINATE THE TRAINING OF ALL PERSONNEL IN THE EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES SYSTEM AND PROVIDE THE NECESSARY STANDARDS AND CERTIFICATION.
- 5. COORDINATE PROGRAMS OF RESEARCH AND EDUCATION RELATING TO EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES.
- 6. COORDINATE THE DEVELOPMENT OF TREATMENT CENTERS
  FOR THE TREATMENT OF EMERGENCY INJURIES AND ILLNESSES.
- 7. COORDINATE THE FURTHER DEVELOPMENT OF SPECIALTY
  REFERRAL CENTERS FOR RESUSCITATION, TREATMENT AND REHABILITATION
  OF THE CRITICALLY ILL AND INJURED AND TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL
  SUPPORT, COORDINATION AND COOPERATION TO THE ALREADY ESTABLISHED
  SPECIALTY REFERRAL CENTERS AT JOHNS HOPKINS HOSPITAL AND BALTIMORE
  CITY HOSPITALS.
- 8. MAINTAIN A CLOSE WORKING RELATIONSHIP WITH THE MARYLAND HOSPITAL ASSOCIATION AND THE REGIONAL EMS ADVISORY COUNCILS TO ASSURE THAT THE EMERGENCY CRITICALLY ILL AND INJURED PATIENT ARE TREATED IN THOSE INSTITUTIONS CAPABLE OF PROVIDING THOSE STANDARDS OF CARE NECESSARY FOR SURVIVAL.
- 9. PROVIDE AN EVALUATION PROGRAM TO INCLUDE A SYSTEM OF COST-ANALYSIS AND COST-EFFECTIVENESS OF THE DELIVERY OF EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES.
- 10. RECEIVE AND ADMINISTER ALL STATE AND FEDERAL BUDGETED FUNDS PERTAINING TO EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES IN MARYLAND.
- 11. MAINTAIN A CLOSE WORKING RELATIONSHIP WITH THE MARYLAND FIRE AND RESCUE INSTITUTE AND WILL RELY ON THIS INSTITUTE TO MAINTAIN ITS RESPONSIBILITY FOR BASIC EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN TRAINING. ADVANCED BASIC EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN TRAINING WILL BE THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE MARYLAND INSTITUTE FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES.
- 12. ASSURE CONTINUED INPROVEMENT OF TRANSPORTATION

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
MARYLAND, That Sections 460 through 466 be and they are hereby
added to Article 41 - Governor - Executive and Administrative Departments, and under the new subtitle "The Maryland Institute for
Emergency Medical Services", of the Annotated Code of Maryland
(1971 Replacement Volume and 1974 Supplement) to read as follows:

SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That all books, papers, files, records, furniture, fixtures, and all other personal property owned by or in the custody of any office, board, commission, department or agency abolished by this Act, shall be transferred to and be in the ownership or custody of the Maryland Emergency Medical Services Administration.

SECTION. 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That all appropriations and credits on the books, papers, and accounts of any office, board, commission, department or agency for and to the credit of any office or agency abolished by this Act, and all liabilities and obligations of any such office, board, commission, department or agency shall be transferred to and become the appropriations, credits, liabilities, and obligations of the Maryland Emergency Medical Services Administration.

SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That if any provision of this Act or the application thereof to any person or circumstances shall not affect other provisions or applications thereof which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application; and to that end, all parts, sections, and parts of sections of this Act are declared to be severable.

SECTION 8. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Act shall take effect July 1, 1975.

all persons who are classified employees of any office, board, commission, department or agency which is abolished by this Act, shall retain their merit system status, except as otherwise specifically provided in this Act; and all employees of the University of Maryland transferred to the Maryland Emergency Medical Services Administration by this Act who are not classified employees but who have generally comparable rights and benefits under the University's employment system shall, subject to the provisions of Section 430 (d) of Article 41, become classified employees of the Maryland Emergency Medical Services Administration without loss of benefits or diminution in salary.

Center for the Study of Trauma and also provided for five medical
service regions within the State; and

WHEREAS, The Maryland Emergency Medical Services System utilizes the resources and expertise of all departments; transportation, safety, education, and planning as well as the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to achieve its goals in the delivery

Agency has been designated as the sole agency for administering and supervising the administration of the State's health planning functions and is directed to prepare policies and procedures designed to provide for comprehensive State planning for health services, including the facilities and persons required for the provision of such services; and

WHEREAS. There exists a pressing need throughout the State of Maryland to provide an Emergency Medical System whereby critically ill and injured patients may be transported expeditiously to the nearest health institution equipped to treat the particular needs of the patient; and
