# ate Police Superintendent Defends ov. Mandel's Use Of Helicopters

State Police officials yesterday defended Governor Mandel's use of their helicopters, noting it is only one part of the aircraft program.

Col. Thomas S. Smith, the police superintendent, told an afternoon press conference that although medical evacuation is the helicopters' top priority, they still are "multi-mission machines," with many other duties.

He said the State Police place no restrictions on the Governor if an aircraft is available for his use. He said the Governor is often asked to explain the purpose of his transportation, whether state, political or personal.

### "The Governor's Business"

"That (trip purpose) is the Governor's business and I don't think it's my responsibility to interrogate him on it," Colonel Smith said.

State Senator John J. Bishop, Jr. (R., Baltimore 10th), point man for the Republican opposition to the Mandel administration, has criticized the use of the State Police aircraft by the Governor and other state officials. He has introduced a bill to restrict use of the helicopters to the State Police on official business.

But Colonel Smith noted that only 1.3 per cent of the flights made in the last five years have been under the VIP designation on State Police flight logs. Any state officer or non-State Police passenger would be listed under that heading.

He also said 22.5 per cent of the flights have been Medivac-related while the largest percentage of flights, 61.5, were traffic missions.

### A Right And A Reason

The Governor has not commented on the reports about his use of the State Police aircraft, but Colonel Smith, who also was among those listed on some VIP flights, said the Governor had both a right and a reason to use the helicopters.

"The Governor is commander-in-chief of the Maryland State Police," he said, "and the helicopters and the Aviation Division were set up to fly

the Governor and State Police officials on official business.

"The Governor is a busy man and I'm pretty busy myself. I find it expedient to fly to meetings and such and I'm sure he does, too," he said.

He then said again he did not find it his or the State Police's responsibility to question the Governor on why he was using the aircraft.

### 'Inaccurate' Reports

He said reports that use of the helicopters by Governor Mandel and other state officers might be a violation of the criteria for a federal grant were inaccurate.

"We have properly reported all activities of the helicopters purchased with (federal) government funds," Colonel Smith said.

"We have always complied with Department of Transportation regulations on reporting how we use that money."
