ADMISSION

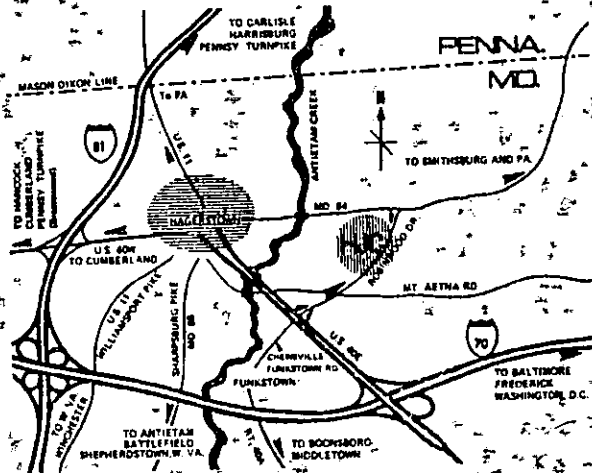

COURSE OF STUDY

The one-year certificate Paramedic program is offered primarily for individuals who wish to take an active part in providing emergency medical care to the community in which they live through active participation in their local rescue, squad and through completion of college-level courses designed to upgrade their skill and knowledge levels. The Emergency Medical Technician-Ambulance (EMT-A) course and the Caravan Rescue Technician (CRT) course are not offered as a part of the regular college credit offerings, but rather must be taken through approved state instructional agencies offering these courses in cooperation with the State Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, Division of Emergency Medical Services. The courses are normally scheduled as a part of the non-credit offerings of the Office of Community Services within the College and may be taken in that manner.

Students desiring credit for successful completion of the EMT-A and CRT courses must present evidence of state certification to the Registrar of the College. Other courses listed in the certificate program may be taken through regularly scheduled credit classes.

FIELD EXPERIENCE

Students are required to complete at least one year of active participation with a local rescue squad prior to being eligible for graduation. Students must plan on completing the EMT-A course prior to the year of field experience. Also, students may take the CRT course only after completing the EMT-A course and being a member of a rescue squad for one year.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Students desiring to enroll in the Paramedic certificate program should understand the purpose of this curriculum is not to prepare individuals for primary employment, but rather to prepare students for service as volunteer members of local rescue squads in the community. While this level of training may lead to employment in some communities in the state or region, students should not rely upon this training as the basis for seeking employment following graduation.
