

### Maryland EMS Olympics

The "kickoff" to Maryland EMS Week, the first annual EMS Olympics focused on emergency personnel demonstrating their life-saving skills. The Maryland Institute for Emergency Medical Services Systems and the EMS provider agencies that it coordinates sponsored the October 10 event at the State Fairgrounds. More than 4,000 spectators attended.

Twenty teams -- each consisting of three EMTs -- participated in a Skills Competition that ran continuously for five hours. The representatives from both paid and volunteer companies throughout Maryland competed by responding to three simulated emergencies: a grain explosion, cardiac arrest, and an auto accident. Required to participate in each of the three situations, each team member was allowed 20 minutes to evaluate and treat the moulaged victims, using basic life support techniques. Joppa-Magnolia Volunteer Fire Company won first place, \$1,000; Hagerstown Community Rescue Service, second place and \$750; Odenton Volunteer Fire Company, third place and \$500.

Other activities scheduled throughout the day included skydivers; auto extrication demonstrations; aerial rescues; Maryland State Police Med-Evac, U.S. Army, and Maryland National Guard helicopter displays; and EMS awards. Thirty EMS exhibits were also on view.

The winners were: First Place, Joppa-Magnolia Volunteer Fire Company; Second Place, Hagerstown Community Rescue Service and Third Place, Odenton Volunteer Fire Company.

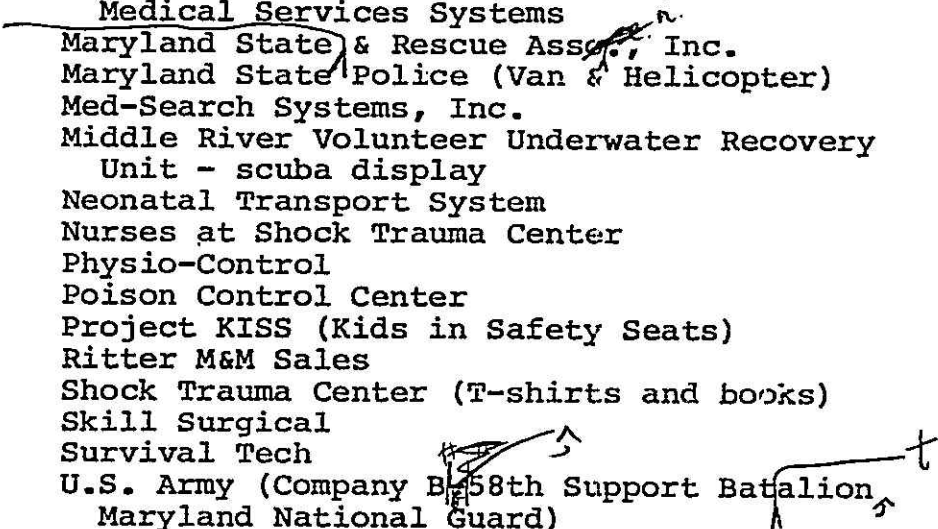

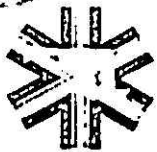

# THIRD ANNUAL STATEWIDE EMT SKILLS COMPETITION

"The Third Annual Statewide EMT Skills Competition is scheduled for Sunday, November 16 at the Anchorage Fire Department Training Center on Airport Heights Road," announced Alaska Paramedical Association President Sherrie Foster. The written exam will begin at 7:00 A.M. and the skills competition will run from 8:00 A.M. until 4:00 P.M.

"We hope to see last year's winning team, Denali Ski Patrol, back to defend challenges by teams from around the state," said Foster. "However, each provider agency may be represented by only one team, so

hand knowledge, nor would they have easy access to the patient's room during an acute emergency.

### Storage

The storage area should be physically close to the ER and should be locked. A locked closet set aside for this purpose alone is ideal. Equipment not locked up, tends to "walk". If the storage location is any distance from the ER, equipment tends not to make it there, and once there, it tends to sit a long time before it is actually returned.

### Recordkeeping

There should be written documentation of equipment received. Again, the same checklist could be used. This is important for follow-up if there is a question of equipment being lost.

### Specific Instructions for Return

Finally, it should be clear how equipment is to be returned. Over the last four years, Providence has compiled a list of ambulance services and their instructions for how they want equipment returned, but there are still some gaps. For instance, Ambulance Service "X" says it will pick up its own equipment, but it never does.

"Airland" is a private carrier which will pick up equipment to take to the air carriers—it is very helpful and reliable. In general most litters could be returned through "Airland".

### High Costs

The cost of returning equipment via "Airland" and the airlines is high — \$20 to \$30 per item. Therefore, for the average transport with a litter, a bag of blankets and possibly a splint, the cost approaches \$100. Could this cost be covered by third party payments? This would help ensure a workable system which does not rely on state support or local donations.

local organizations are encouraged to sponsor run-offs to pick their best representative."

The competition will be open to any two-person team with EMT-I, EMT-II or advanced first aid training. Other medically trained personnel who are functioning as EMTs, such as nurses, physician assistants, or paramedics, will not be eligible to compete, Sherrie said, but she did urge them to volunteer to be judges and to assist with the competition in other ways, by calling 274-3651.

The written test and series of practicals will test EMT-I level skills and will include four skill stations and a CPR station set up on a format similar to the National Registry's exam. The practicals will not require skill in IV Therapy, MAST trousers or EOAs.

Each team will be required to bring along the following basic equipment—one set per team is minimum, one set per person is better: bandage scissors, penlight, stethoscope and blood pressure cuff. All other equipment will be supplied.

Participation in the competition will be limited to 20 teams so get your entry forms in as soon as possible. Teams are required to send in their entry forms and a \$25.00 entry fee postmarked no later than midnight, October 31. Complete information and entry forms will be sent out to all EMS provider organizations within a few weeks or else clip the form from **RESPONSE** and mail to:

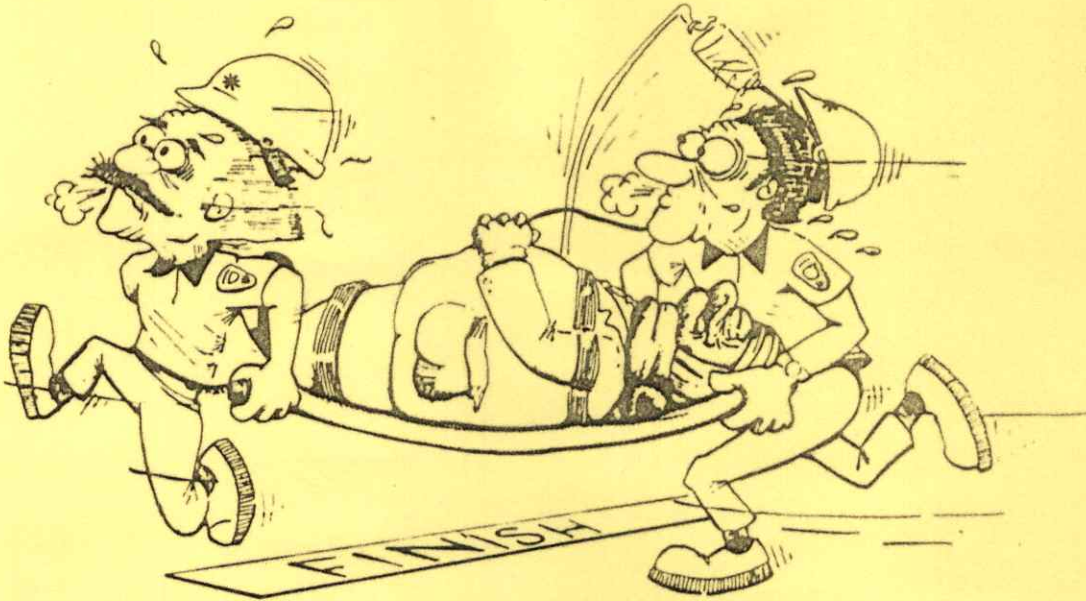

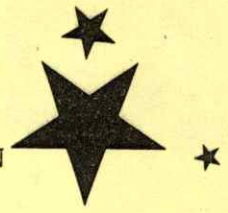
