#### INCIDENT

At approximately 12:30 p.m., an aircraft with 150 persons on board lands on Runway 04 at BWI. During after-landing rollout on the runway, its left landing gear collapses, a wing separates, and a fire ensues. Crash-Rescue is initiated.

The Federal Aviation Administration airport control tower will initiate the EPLEX 82 training exercise via the Airport crash telephone network on sighting white smoke originating from the incident site.

#### ACTION

BWI Airport emergency procedures will be implemented. The Operations Center will establish an on-scene command post. Emergency apparatus from the Airport and from supporting agencies off-airport will respond.


