The awards are presented by the Maryland Institute for Emergency Medical Services Systems during EMS Week (May 23-29). EMS Week is observed each year to educate the public about emergency care, to recognize EMS providers for their service throughout the year, and to highlight ways to prevent injury.

AWARDS TO BE PRESENTED TO FIRE/EMERGENCY MEDICAL PERSONNEL IN ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY

Firefighters and emergency medical personnel from Anne
Arundel County will be honored for taking life-saving and selfsacrificing actions during the past year.

They will receive their awards at a reception to be held at 1:30 p.m., Thursday, May 27 at the R Adams Cowley Shock Trauma Center Auditorium in Baltimore. Marylanders throughout the state will be honored at that time for their extraordinary efforts in delivering prehospital emergency care or improving Maryland's system of emergency medical care.

The statewide awards reception is one of the activities scheduled during Maryland EMS Week (May 23-29), and ties in with the theme "We're Ready--Are You?"

Firefighter Barton D. Shortall, EMT-P, and Lt. James D. Kruger, both with the Anne Arundel County Fire Department, were dispatched to the Maryland House of Corrections in Jessup on July 10th, where two men had been stabbed. Working under a "lock

down" situation, Firefighter Shortall and Lt. Kruger stabilized the victims (one in trauma arrest and the other with a pneumothorax) and prepared them for transport to a hospital. Certificates of honor will be presented to the rescuers for their effective use of emergency medical procedures under adverse conditions.

Also to be honored during the May 27th ceremony are four members of the Anne Arundel County Fire Department—Captain Gary Sheckells, Deputy Chief Charles "Gary" Rogers, Firefighter Deborah Rodey, and Acting Lt. Michele Delalla. While white water rafting on the Cheat River near Albright, West Virginia, last summer, they became instrumental in the rescue and attempted resuscitation of a woman thrown from another raft. The rescuers maintained CPR on the victim for an hour, until a helicopter from Pittsburgh could reach the isolated location. Unfortunately, the woman did not survive. But the rescuers are being recognized for their proficient teamwork and ingenuity in attempting to resuscitate their patient and directing additional emergency assistance to the scene.
